SALT.

How to Have a Gospel-Centered Conversation

SALT is a simple tool that helps us turn an everyday interaction into a meaningful, Gospel-centered conversation.

S stands for Start a conversation.

Starting can be as simple as saying, “Hey, how are you?” “What’s your name?” “Where are you from?” or even, “I like your shoes.” Introduce yourself, look the person in the eyes, shake their hand, and show them that you genuinely see them. You do not need a perfect opening line. You just need the courage to begin.

A stands for Ask a question.

Specific questions lead to specific answers. Jesus said that the mouth speaks from the overflow of the heart. When we ask thoughtful questions, we begin to discover what is happening in someone’s heart. You might ask, “What are you passionate about?” “What is your biggest dream?” “What has God been showing you lately?” or “Is there anything I could pray for you about?” Their answer can help you understand where they are spiritually and how you can encourage them.

L stands for Listen.

Do not just wait for your turn to speak. Genuinely listen. One of the most powerful things we can do as believers is show people that we care about their story, their struggles, their dreams, and their heart. Listening builds trust and helps us recognize where God may already be working in their life.

T stands for Tell your testimony or tell the Gospel.

Connect what they shared to what Jesus has done in your life. For example, someone may ask what you are passionate about. You could say, “I am passionate about freedom. For a long time, I thought freedom meant doing whatever I wanted. But when I tried to stop, I realized I was actually controlled by those things. Then I discovered that Jesus did not only come to forgive my sins—He came to free me from sin. That changed everything.” Your testimony does not need to be long. Simply share who you were, what Jesus did, and how your life is different now.

Start. Ask. Listen. Tell.

You do not have to force a conversation. Love the person, listen to the Holy Spirit, and trust God with the result.

2 The Lifestyle: The Power of Presence

**Evangelism begins long before
the conversation starts.**

The “Pre-Evangelism” Lifestyle:

Focus on loving service, radical generosity, and genuine friendship. People rarely care what you know until they know you care.

Scripture: “In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.” (**Matthew 5:16**)

The Role of the Holy Spirit

Evangelism is a spiritual work. We rely on the Spirit to convict and open hearts.

Scripture: “But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth... He will prove the world to be in the wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment.” (**John 16:8, 13**)

How to Pray for People, Naturally

Prayer is simply a conversation
between two people and their Creator.

Ask Permission

Keep it low-pressure. “Would you mind if I said a quick prayer for you regarding that?”

Keep it Brief

Don’t turn it into a sermon.

Scripture: “For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them.” (**Matthew 18:20**)

4 Your Testimony in 30 Seconds

**Your story is the most unique evidence
of God's grace you possess.**

Before

"I used to feel [empty/anxious/lost]."

Encounter

"Then, I encountered the love of Jesus through [a
verse/a friend/a moment of realization]."

After

"Now, I have a sense of purpose and peace I never
thought possible."

Scripture: "Instead, you must worship Christ as Lord of
your life. And if someone asks about your hope as a
believer, always be ready to explain it." **(1 Peter 3:15)**

5 Explaining the Gospel Simply

The Gospel is the good news that God restores what was broken.

Point

Focus

God's Love

He created us for relationship (John 3:16).

The Problem

We chose to go our own way, creating a gap (Romans 3:23).

The Solution

Jesus bridged that gap through His death and resurrection (Romans 5:8).

The Response

We accept this gift of grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8-9).

6 Follow-Up Templates for New Believers

The “Next Steps” Check-in

“It was so great talking to you the other day! I’ve been thinking about what you said. Would you be open to grabbing coffee soon to keep chatting about that?”

The Encouragement Text

“Hey! Just wanted to share this verse that encouraged me today: ‘[Insert Verse].’ Thought you might appreciate it. Hope your week is going great!”

Final Encouragement: You don’t have to be perfect; you just have to be present. As you step out, remember: “For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.” **(2 Timothy 1:7)**

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
